TWEED WHEELS AND TWEEDDALE COMMUNITY TRANSPORT

Both of these projects, supported by *The Bridge* in Peebles, are available to help people with transport.

Tweed Wheels is transport for anyone living in Tweeddale who is registered disabled or who cannot use public transport because of a physical disability. The vehicle is adapted to take a maximum of five passengers along with a driver, up to two of the passengers can be wheelchair users.

Tweeddale Community Transport has a minibus which can take up to 14 passengers or can be adapted to take up to 3 wheelchair users along with a reduced number of other passengers (depending on the size of the wheelchairs.)The minibus can be used by any non-profit

making community or voluntary group for outings of pretty much any description. Groups can provide their own driver (subject to training) or may wish to use one of the services team of volunteer drivers. Groups need to be registered with the project to make use of the Tweeddale Community Transport bus.

September Wild Side

In September, we see the start of inevitable turn to Autumn, as morning mists hang low in the valley cloaking the fields whilst along hedges and fences we can see the pearly gossamer of spiders' webs.

This is the perfect time to see lots of fungi as they produce the visible fruiting bodies with which we are familiar. Fungi are unlike anything else. They are not classified as animals or plants but as whole group on their own and are hugely diverse in their appearance. They can appear anywhere – in fields, verges, up trees, bare ground (or old bread!) and many are an important part of the rotting process of dead plants and animals. The picture sent in by Chris and Val is, I think, a kind of bracket fungus called a Dryad's Saddle, which is quite a common fungus. Bracket fungi cause decay and rot in the heartwood of trees and produce these bracket-shaped fruiting bodies on the trunk or main branches. These fungi can lead to the weakening and eventual breakage of affected trees although most of the fungi described as 'brackets' only live on and decay the heartwood, they do not infect and kill the living parts of the tree. The brackets release huge quantities of wind blown spores which germinate on wounded wood and penetrate into the heartwood, where the fungus forms an expanding pocket of rot.

Birds now have their fresh plumage and are returning to visible feeding often still in family groups. The garden

feeders are becoming busy again with greenfinches, woodpeckers and nuthatches visiting regularly along with the more common tits and sparrows, although there's still plenty of natural food available. Greenfinches have apparently nationally suffered a decline due to a parasitic disease so I'm pleased to see some on our nut feeders.

The late butterflies are still on the wing spending much of their time feeding whilst many caterpillars will be feeding up ready to spend their winter hibernating as a chrysalis. Trees are starting to show a change in leaf colour and lots of hips and haws are turning red. Hedgerow fruits are plentiful this year with lots of brambles and berries. This is the month for conkers or horse chestnuts which drop to the ground in their spiky green cases protecting those lovely shiny fruits with which to battle.

So while you're out for a walk, whether a local wander to gather fruits for jam- making, in the garden or as part of the Walking Festival, keep your eyes peeled and enjoy the great outdoors while making the most of some late summer sunshine.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank staff members for their dedication, hard work and commitment to the children they cared for and I wish them every success in the future in finding new

employment. Thank you for all the hard work, time and effort that all the Committee's past and present have put in since its inception in January 2003. Thank you to everybody who has donated their time or money during fundraising activities or their advice and expertise in helping the new Committee form and move forward. Thank you also to the School for allowing the Club to operate there and for always being so accommodating and supportive. A big thanks however must go to the parents and children who have continued to support the Club.

Walkerburn Out of School Club has played such a large part in my own and many other children's lives for many years and it will be very sorely missed by them and all the other children who regularly attended it.

WALKERBURN & DISTRICT POLICE REPORT AUGUST 2010

Since the last meeting held on Monday 19th July 2010 a total of 17 calls have been made to the Police concerning the Walkerburn beat area. These are broken down as follows:

Reported crime: 3 - Misc calls to assist public: 8 - Road Traffic (inc accidents/livestock/obstructions): 6

28/07/10 Between 10pm 27/07/10 and 9am 28/07/10 a silver BMX bike has been stolen from outside an address in Tweedholm Avenue. Unfortunately the bike was not secured. Local enquiry has been made with no one being identified for the crime.

04/08/10 Sometime between 02/08 and 04/08 a flower pot has been removed from the front of a property in Caberston Road. The pot itself is brown in colour with a pattern around the top lip. At the time the pot had red Geraniums growing within. Local enquiry has been met with a negative result.

WALKERBURN & DISTRICT COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Below are the draft Minutes of the WCC Meeting held on 16th August 2010

Present:

Members: Mr G Thornton (Chairman), Mrs PS Purves (Secretary), Mr R Brett, Mrs S Horsburgh, Miss MM McIntosh MBE, Ms I Ogilvie, Mr JJ Purves, Mrs L Thornton.

Ex Officio: Cllr G Logan

ITEM 1: Chairman's Introduction. The Chairman welcomed everyone.

ITEM 2: Open Questions. A resident had raised the question again of the patch of over-grown ground in front of the new development in Tweedholm Avenue. The secretary reminded members that Mr Fraser, the developer, was supposed to landscape this area as a condition of his planning consent but that repeated attempts had failed to produce a result. It seemed likely that either residents of the new houses would have to take action or that WCC would have to try to arrange something. The secretary would seek advice.

ITEM 3: Monthly Report from WCDT. The Secretary WCDT reported that:

a. Allotments Development. Plans had been approved and work would start soon.

b. Visit to Skye with Vattenfall. The visit to Skye had been useful in general terms but had little relevance to the position on the Minch Moor especially as the landowner in question was private.

c. The Dev Trust AGM was at 7pm on Monday 23rd August.

ITEM 4: Police Business. PC Craig Rogerson had sent in a short police report. The Community Safety Partnership (Mrs Borthwick and Mrs Purves represented Walkerburn) had manned a successful stand with the Police Contact vehicle and the Fire Brigade at Peebles Show. There would be an Open Day at Peebles Police Station on Saturday 4th September.

ITEM 5: Apologies and Notices. Apologies had been received from Cllr Garvie, Cllr Herd and Mr Brett.

ITEM 6: Minutes of July Meeting.

Mrs Horsburgh proposed adoption of the Minutes of the July meeting seconded by Ms Ogilvie. Passed.

ITEM 7: Matters Arising.

a. Item 4. Traffic Through Village. Cllr Logan reported that he had had a reasonably positive response to his request for help is slowing traffic through the village and that he would continue to seek action.

b. Item 7. Nursery School Places. The Council would not budge on the WCC reasonable request that families in Walkerburn who had been promised places should get them since there was no cost involved – equal misery for all across the Borders appeared to be the Rule. Members expressed their dismay at such apparently unnecessary bureaucracy.

c. Item 9. Members for Elder Voice Team. There had been no volunteers and the secretary would respond accordingly.

ITEM 8: Planning

a. Draft Supplementary Planning guidance on Wind Energy on website: www.scotborders.gov.uk/life/planningandbuilding/plan_sandresearch/31118.html. The secretary would circulate a draft response for comment. Comments required by 8 September.

b. Minch Moor Windfarm. The windfarm had been rejected unanimously by the SBC Planning Committee on the advice of the Planning Officers. It was not known whether or not the company will appeal but they have 3 months in which to do so. If they appeal, there will almost certainly be a Public Enquiry.

ITEM 9: Correspondence. The list had been circulated to Members as usual. The secretary drew attention to the following:

- a. Item 5. Review of Licensing Policy Statement. Comments required by 19 October. Mrs Rodger undertook to prepare comments for the September meeting.
- b. Item 6. SBC Annual Seminar 2nd October. Miss McIntosh was attending. Others should inform the secretary as soon as possible.
- c. Item 12. Digital Strategy for the Borders. Mrs Horsburgh will prepare comments for the September meeting.
- d. Item 13. Libel and Slander Insurance. No one felt that this was worthwhile and the secretary will respond to SBC accordingly.
- e. Item 14. Community Volunteer tasks. Pulling up Himalayan Balsam and other invasive weeds was proposed and will be added to the list by the secretary.

ITEM 10: Community Gain Negotiations. Negotiations with Vattenfall would continue. A list of possible construction-type tasks which could be undertaken whilst the windfarm is being developed had been produced and would be placed eventually in Burning Issues to seek residents' views and priorities. Vattenfall were still negotiating on the low average basis where they began and were pushing a 1% of profit scheme with a minimum per wattage payment of £1750. This still gave a very low annual payment to each of the three communities and the team would continue to press for a better offer.

ITEM 11: Reports by Members.

- a. Mrs Rodger reported that the Festival Committee were waiting for a response from Street Lighting on their request to use lampposts from Christmas lights

and that she was in contact with Jean Robertson at SBC for grant advice. Everyone agreed that this sounded very positive and congratulated the Festival Committee and Mrs Rodger on the progress made.

- b. Two issues had been raised re signage in the village: the lack of any sign to Walkerburn on the Back Road which meant cyclists in particular often assumed they'd reached Innerleithen, and the lack of a sign to the school from the A72. The secretary would seek advice.
- c. Mrs Horsburgh displayed a piece of Himalayan Balsam, an invasive weed which had reached the village via flood water in spring and which undermined river banks. She reported that the tweed Commissioners saw it as a lower priority than Japanese Knotweed but that it was advisable to cut it back once it had flowered to stop it spreading. All agreed to be on the look-out for it: the secretary will collate a list of patches around the village and seek SB Local and other help to cut it back.

ITEM 12: Reports by SBC Councillors. Cllr Logan felt everything had been covered. The Chairman made the point that all members felt that Cllr Logan was an effective and helpful councillor and that Walkerburn was lucky to have three such excellent councillors as Cllrs Logan, Herd and Garvie.

ITEM 13: Any Other Business. Nil
