Walkerburn played host to Clydebank, from the West of Scotland regional leagues, in the second of their pre-season 'friendlies', after a defeat in the first game against a very strong Selkirk Stormers side at Philiphaugh. Back at Caberston Haugh, the 'Burn were on familiar ground in front of good home support (who provided their usual range of informative and well researched advice on refereeing and try scoring from the deck outside the club rooms!).

The first half ended with Walkerburn 15-5 to the good. The second half started with the prospect of a wind assisted second half ahead some promising play

With the score standing at 43-5 and into the game's last quarter Clydebank could have been forgiven if they had thrown in the towel, but to their credit they continued to show spirit as they took the game to Walkerburn - ably supported by the 'Burn's own James Fresle, who had been loaned to the Westerners before kick-off. Walkerburn's final score came in the 73rd minute with a converted try to bring their finally tally to 50 points.

In all, a good win. But the 'Burn will face tougher opposition than Clydebank in the coming season. September Wildside

The garden birds are starting to return, especially the robin, singing from the tree tops and hedges.

With the colder nights of the last week, Autumn is definitely approaching and some of the trees are showing their Autumn colours in their leaves and as is usual at this time of year, worm casts are appearing on the grass. While it can be a pain when the soil is tramped indoors on your feet, worms are invaluable. They are like mini tractors, tilling the soil and making it a better place for plants to grow. That's why gardeners love them; they help look after our veg. Birds, badgers, moles, hedgehogs and even foxes feed on them too and in ploughed fields buzzards can be seen rummaging in the furrows for an easy meal.

Being outside with nature can be a great stress reliever. When was the last time you spent some time outside whether in your garden or further afield and just paid attention to everything around you -the sights, smells and sounds of the world such as the buzz of insects and birdsong or the perfume of flowers? Keeping your eyes peeled when listening to birdsong is a great way to start identifying a species of bird by its song. You'll be surprised how quickly you can learn what birds are

visiting your garden just by hearing them. Insects make different noises too. Bees and hoverflies even butterflies all make a different sound. You just need to zone in and enjoy all the colours in all their differing shades from the insects to flowers, leaves, fruit and seeds and of course the birds. You'll soon find you're more relaxed. And don't forget to use your sense of touch. Feel the bark of a tree or run your hands through the grass –just avoid nettles or anything jaggy. That would be an extreme sensation! Nature is building up for its harvest festival with lots of fruit and seeds on the trees and plants. Of course this includes conkers or horse chestnuts still in their green cases but you can be sure inside, a shiny brown chestnut is forming. Must nearly be time for the conker championships again.
